Who is the ESVBA?

- The ESVBA is the [Eastern Shore of Virginia Broadband Authority](#)
- The ESVBA is a Public Authority, which is made of five board members. The ESVBA was created by a Joint resolution of Accomack & Northampton Counties under the Virginia Wireless Act on April 17, 2008.
- The ESVBA is similar to a utility and owns, operates, and maintains an open access network.
- What have we done?...



What has ESVBA Accomplished?

- Constructed approximately 300 route miles of fiber.
- Repaid Accomack and Northampton Counties the initial start up money they provided in March 2016
- Funds its capital program (network extensions, equipment upgrades, etc.) internally with revenues from operations.
- We serve 142 wholesale, 34 governmental, 25 educational, 42 enterprise, 17 healthcare, and 57 residential addresses.

Fiber to the Home

- ESVBA Board of Directors authorized a fiber to the home in Harborton in September 2016
- New GPON (Gigabit Passive Optical Network) technology is being implemented utilizing fiber in a highly-efficient manner.
- ESVBA Board of Directors authorized expanding the FTTH areas to Bobtown/Pungoteague and Church Neck area in March of 2017
- December 2017, the ESVBA Board approved opening the remaining 21 areas as the staff can sustain the openings.



FTTH expanded

- *The ESVBA has now opened:*
 - *Cheapside*
 - *Cobbs Station*
 - *Accomac*
 - *Townsend/Latimer Siding*
 - *Greenbackville*
 - *Atlantic*
 - *Wattsville/Horntown*
- *The ESVBA will open the remaining areas over the remaining 14 areas over the next 7-9months.*
